# **COVID-19 Safety**

Thank you for keeping our community safe by completing the Screening Questionnaire each day. If your child(ren) has any symptoms, they may not come to school. You are to phone Alberta 811. Let's keep our community safe. Here is a question that we get asked a lot at school so we would like to clarify:

If my child started isolating less than 10 days ago because they had symptoms of cough, fever, shortness of breath, runny nose or sore throat

on the screening questionnaire and they are feeling better now can they come to school?



No. They must legally self-isolate for 10 days or until symptoms resolve whichever is longer. If they get a negative COVID-19 test AND they have NO SYMPTOMS they may return to school.
