COVID-19 Mandates

As of March 1st, Premier Kenney has removed a number of the provincial mandates in Alberta.

The mandate that does remain for schools is that if a student or staff member does test positive for COVID 19, isolation is still mandatory.

The mandates that remain in place include:

- Use of the Alberta Daily Health Checklist and staying home when sick (includes isolation and quarantine requirements)
- Promoting and facilitating hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette
- Optional use of masks by students, staff and visitors
- Cleaning of high touch surfaces

Reading

Here is an interesting fact:

Student A Reads

- 20 Minutes A Day
- 3 600 Minutes Per School Year
- 1 800 000 Words Per Year

Student B Reads

- 5 Minutes A Day
- 900 Minutes Per School Year
- 282 000 Words Per Year

Student C Reads

- 1 Minute A Day
- 180 Minutes Per School Year
- 8 000 Words Per Year

If a student starts reading 20 minutes per night in kindergarten, by the end of sixth grade student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days. Student B will have read for 12 school days and student C will have read for 3. Reading does make for better readers. We can do this together!
